SIKH ETHOS

At Pioneer Secondary Academy, the Sikh spirit is the heartbeat of the school. We believe in excellence in all that we do. The spiritual, moral, social and cultural element of our school culture is taken very seriously. We believe that as well as academic excellence and a world class education, our students deserve the opportunity to develop internally. Making the right choices, becoming ambassadors and catalysts of change by serving others is very high on our agenda.

The Sikh values of Naam Japna (to meditate daily) Kirat Karni (to work with integrity) and Vand Chakna (to share with others) is what we value the most. On site, we have a beautiful Gurdwara that is open to all faiths and none. We have a daily spiritual practice of meditation and encourage active listening and mindfulness.

Our Gurdwara is a safe space for young people to come and sit, reflect, practice kirtan, experiment with diverse music genres including a fusion of classical and modern styles.



Our students are leaders in the Gurdwara and engage in traditional Gurmukhi and modern languages giving them the edge above others.

Each student is given the opportunity to learn and perform actions according to the Sikh Rehat Maryadha (Code of conduct) as well as learn how to run a Gurdwara by experiencing and practising each element personally. Our programme allows students to train one another to grow both, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.

Our open-door policy means that those from all faiths and none are given the chance to learn and develop themselves through their own faith and belief. Our school takes pride in celebrating auspicious days and making them a part of the calendar to celebrate every student, staff and parent in the school community, creating an atmosphere of inclusion and diversity in all that we do.



STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Student voice is a cornerstone of our school's development. Our student leadership team mirrors senior staff roles. These students spearhead whole school projects, and organise the junior leadership team.

- Some of the responsibilities the student leadership team hold include:
- Running school events such as charity events and enrichment activities
- Delivering assemblies to raise awareness about important world issues
- Leading the day to day operations of the Gurdwara
- Supporting peer's mental health, for which they are provided training
- Interviewing new staff

We firmly believe that empowering our students to influence the direction of our school, will in turn make them more skilled leaders of the future, and strengthen the sense of community at PSA.

COMBINED CADET FORCE

We are proud to be one of only 500 schools in the UK with its own CCF unit. From humble beginnings in October 2018 the unit has grown to almost 60 cadets and 6 staff. We uphold and practise the core values of the British Army – Selfless commitment, Respect for others, Loyalty, Integrity, Discipline and Courage.

CCF has hugely improved my confidence, leadership, and self-belief, making me both mentally and physically stronger and more resilient. PASTORAL CARE

Our pastoral system ensures every student is known as an individual and receives the support they need. Everyone belongs to a tutor group and their tutor will monitor their overall progress, communicating proactively with parents when needed.

Wellbeing is at the centre of all we do. At PSA we help our students embrace all forms of mindfulness, acknowledging the impact that it has on our own wellbeing and that of others. We embed mindfulness and wellbeing in our assemblies and through our personal development curriculum. From year 7 - 13 students participate in sessions relating to personal health, mental wellbeing, relationships, diversity, personal safety, breathing and meditation. In addition to this Year 13s engage in a 12 session course that focuses on building self esteem and charity work. Year 7-11 engage in a 20 week resilience programme run by the MoonShot series.

- A variety of trips to build student's cultural capital

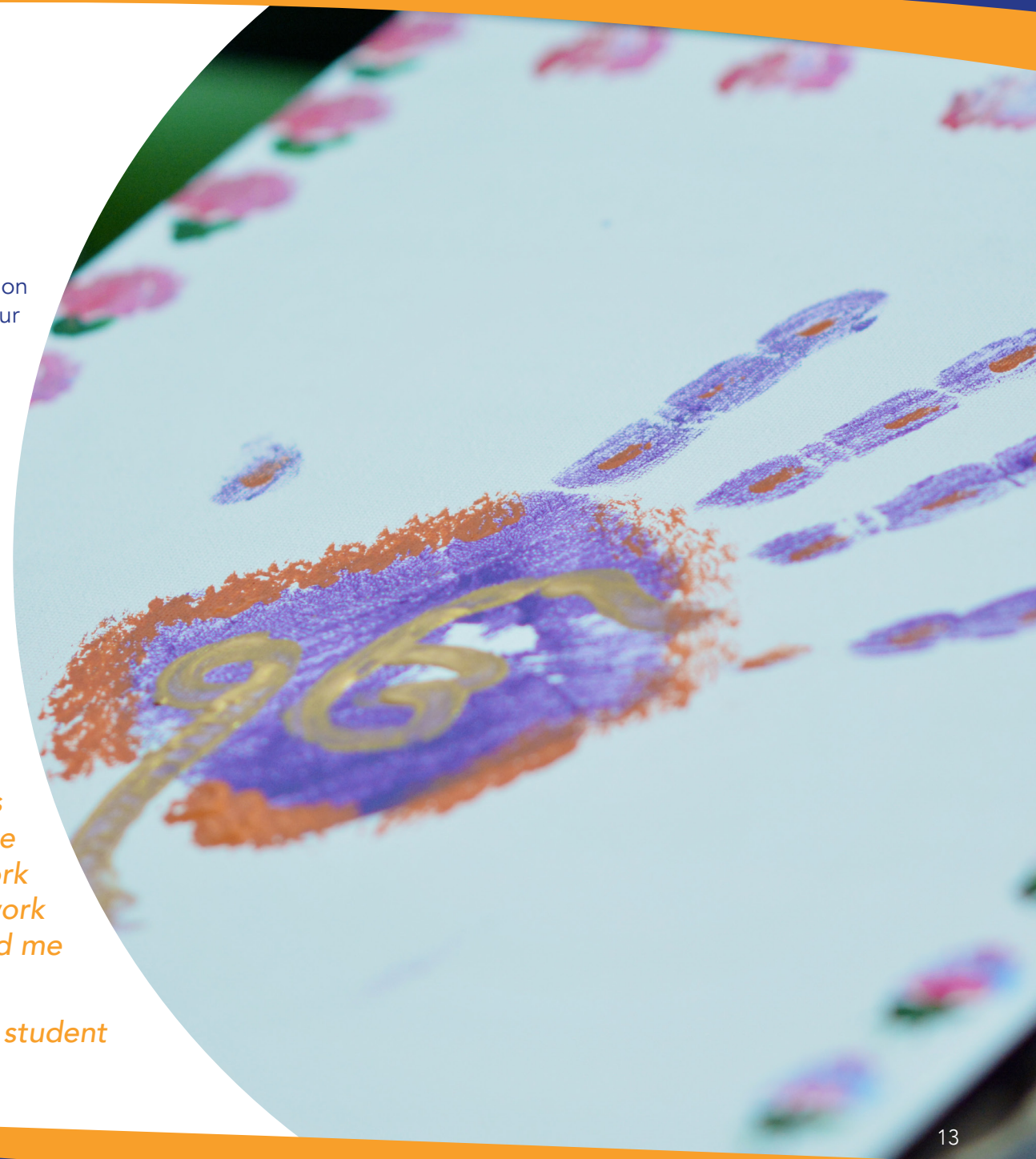
Our extra curricular timetable is constantly evolving based on what students would like to do, and the various talents of our staff body. Some examples of the clubs we offer include:

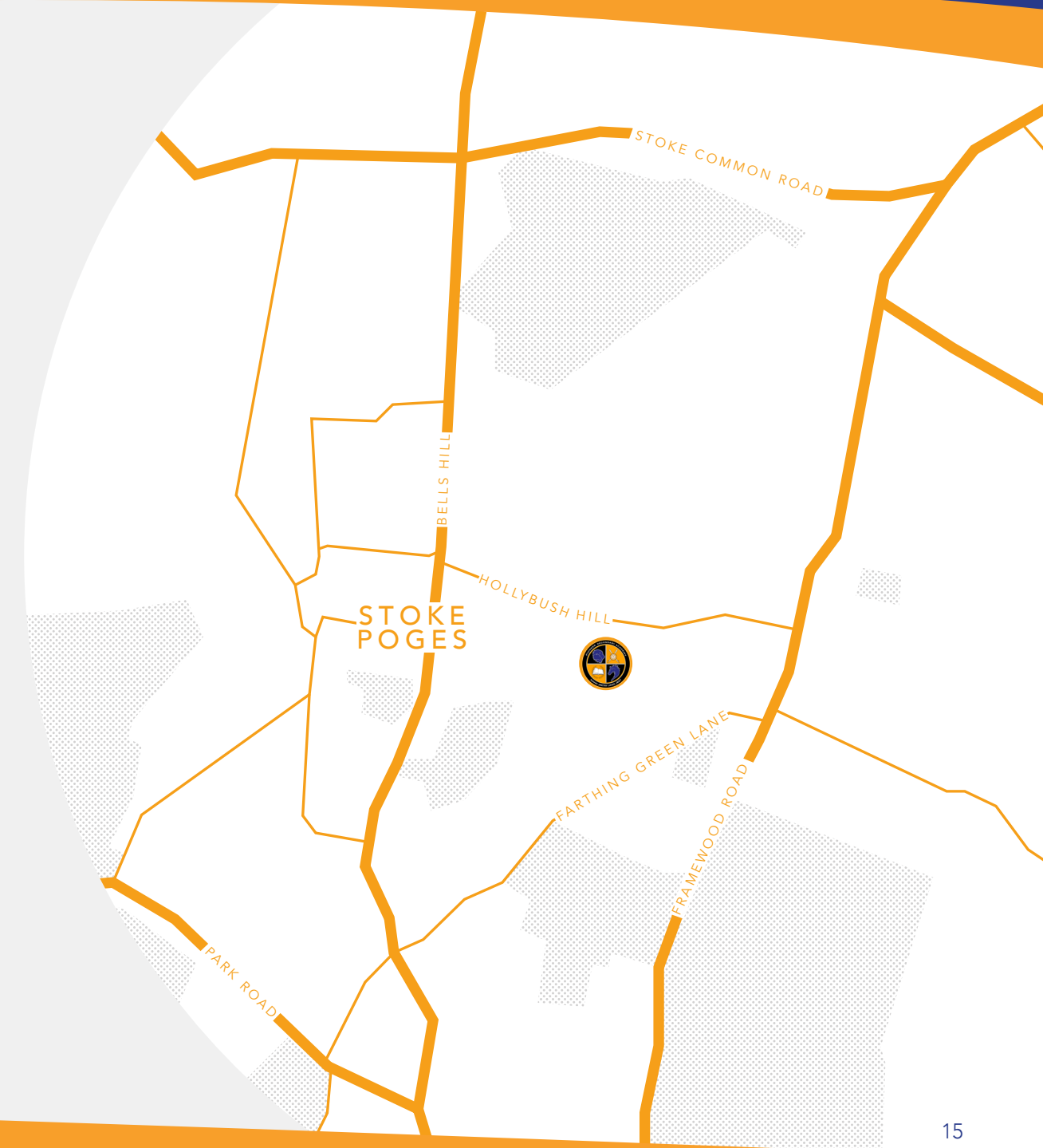
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
