What is this course about?

GCSE English Language is designed on the basis that students should read and be assessed on high-quality, challenging texts from the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries.

The texts, across a range of genres and types, will support students in developing their own writing by providing effective models.

The specification will enable students of all abilities to develop the skills they need to read, understand and analyse a wide range of different texts covering the 19th, 20th and 21st century time periods as well as to write clearly, coherently and accurately using a range of vocabulary and sentence structures.

Transferable skills developed across the two subjects.



What will I learn?

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Language Paper 1 and 2

Reading and Writing Skills involving fiction and non-fiction texts (challenging texts from the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries).

The reading sources act as stimulus for writing tasks, providing students with a clear route through each paper.

- Paper 1, Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing, looks at how writers use narrative and descriptive techniques to engage the interest of readers.
- Paper 2, Writers' Viewpoints and
 Perspectives, looks at how different writers present a similar topic over time.
- Spoken Language Endorsement
