What is this course about?

The aims and objectives of this qualification are to enable students to:

- develop and extend their knowledge and understanding of specified key events, periods and societies in local, British, and wider world history; and of the wide diversity of human experience
- engage in historical enquiry to develop as independent learners and as critical and reflective thinkers
- develop the ability to ask relevant questions about the past, to investigate issues critically and to make valid historical claims by using a range of sources in their historical context
- develop an awareness of why people, events and developments have been accorded historical significance and how and why different interpretations have been constructed about them
- organise and communicate their historical knowledge and understanding in different ways and reach substantiated conclusions.



What will I learn?

Two **depth studies**, each covering a substantial and short time span: one must be a British depth study Elizabethan England 1558-88, a **wider-world depth study**, Cold War 1945-1991 ●

The historic environment through the study of a particular site in its historical context: Whitechapel in 1880-1900

A thematic study involving the study of people, events and developments over a 1000 year period, Crime and Punishment.

A skills and interpretations paper, Weimar and Nazi Germany 1919-39



How will I be assessed?

Paper 1: Thematic study and historic environment. Written examination: 1 hour and 15 minutes 30%* of the qualification 52 marks (16 for the historic environment, 36 for the thematic study)

Paper 2: Period study and British depth study. Written examination: 1 hour and 45 minutes 40%* of the qualification 64 marks (32 for the period study and 32 for the British depth study)

Paper 3: Modern depth study. Written examination: 1 hour and 20 minutes 30%* of the qualification 52 marks
