

POLICE WORKSHOP

Four Met police officers, accompanied by the lead Faith Liaison Officer from the Partnership and Prevention Hub, visited our school to conduct VAWG (Violence Against Women and Girls) workshops. Our students actively participated in the workshops, attentively listening to the measures designed to protect young girls. During the sessions, our students collaboratively identified areas they perceived as less safe and in need of increased surveillance and security. Additionally, the specialist CSE officer (Child Sexual Exploitation) provided valuable insights into the risks and preventive techniques related to such situations. Emphasising the significance of online safety, the officer highlighted the importance of reporting any suspicious online activities immediately.

The workshops facilitated crucial discussions on safeguarding, ensuring that our students are better informed and equipped to stay safe in various environments, both offline and online.





The team started their march in full kit at 1100 hrs. in Ashton Clinton and arrived at Camp near the Ivinghoe Beacon at 2100 hrs.





On the morning of Sunday 18th June, the team, after washing and cooking breakfast in

the field, took down the camp and began the arduous 2 nd day of the hike scaling the

Ivinghoe Beacon as the morning became increasingly hot.
