Chabeel Day

Chabeel Day commemorates the Shaheedi (martyrdom) of Guru Arjan Dev Ji, the Fifth Guru of the Sikhs. In 1606, Guru Arjan Dev Ji was tortured by being placed on a burning hot iron plate with hot sand poured over him because he refused to compromise his faith. Although burning alive, Guru Ji meditated and accepted God's Will as sweet.

Instead of mourning, Sikhs honour Guru Ji's sacrifice by cooling others and staying in Chardi-Kala (high spirits). To remember Guru Ji's Shaheedi and the lesson of acceptance that Guru Ji taught, Sikhs serve Chabeel - a free cold sweet drink given out in summer. Most often, a pink drink made from milk, water, and rosewater syrup is served. Our amazing canteen staff made and served this drink, and Sixth Form sevadaars distributed it to all students during their lunch break.













Commemoration of 1984

In January 2024, the students and staff of Pioneer Secondary Academy began a Sahej Paath - a meditative and reflective reading of the Sri Guru Granth Sahib from start to finish - in honour of the 40th anniversary of the 1984 Sikh genocide.

It has been four decades since the tragic events of 1984. To this day, many individuals continue to bear the emotional scars of the things they witnessed and the loved ones they lost.

On 27 June, the Sahej Paath was completed, and following this, the whole school gathered outside to conduct a ceremony of Nishan Sahib Seva, further enriching the day's significance. This was carried out by our Gurdwara Sevadaars, sixth formers, and staff. Our students performed a beautiful Kirtan throughout the morning, creating an atmosphere of peace and devotion.

For the final event, Louise supported our Year 10s in showcasing their hard work and passion by planning and delivering a fantastic tennis workshop to the Year 7 students.








Slough Sports Network rowing event at Dorney Lake

A big congratulations goes out to the Pioneer Secondary Academy community!








TEACHING AND LEARNING
